

Cautions on Handling the Printer



Cautions for Use and Storage of the Battery

CAUTION	 Charge the battery before using it. Immediately after purchase, the battery is not fully charged. Do not pull or push the battery hook forcefully. Keep the battery terminals clean, so that no dirt or foreign material becomes attached. When cleaning the battery, do not use any solvents, such as alcohol, benzine, or thinner. Doing so may deform or damage the plastic sections. Wipe off any dirt using a dry cloth. The battery slowly loses power while it is not being used. When charging the battery, charge it in an environment that is between 10°C and 30°C. To prevent deterioration in the battery performance, avoid direct sunlight, high temperatures, and high humidity, and store it in a cool location (around 20°C). If storing it for a long period of time, remove it from the printer or battery charger. Also, to prevent deterioration in its performance, we recommend that you charge it approximately once per year. 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Product Overview

This chapter describes the features and overview of the product.

Features

TM-P80II Auto Cutter Model is a thermal mobile printer. The main features of this product are as follows.

Printing

- Maximum printing speed is 65 mm/s (max. 100 mm/s when the anti-curl function is disabled).
- Supports a wide variety of languages (ANK (including Thai) / Japanese (JIS 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th levels) / Simplified Chinese / Traditional Chinese / Korean) controlled by UTF-8

Printer handling

- Compact and lightweight (Wi-Fi model: 58 mm model weighs approx. 520 g {1.15 lb}, 80 mm model weighs approx. 511 g {1.13 lb}) (Bluetooth model: 58 mm model weighs approx. 513 g {1.13 lb}, 80 mm model weighs approx. 504 g {1.11 lb})
- Can be used for a long time with a battery (approx. 24 hours for Wi-Fi model, approx. 34 hours for Bluetooth model)
- Wi-Fi models offer Wi-Fi (IEEE802.11a/b/g/n/ac) function as standard.
- Bluetooth models offer Bluetooth function as standard.

- Wi-Fi or Bluetooth connection status can be easily checked by viewing respective LED lights.

- Equipped with an anti-curl function that reduces curling of roll paper.
- Equipped with an auto cutter.
- Belt clip for improved portability in a mobile environment
- A utility for iOS/Android™ (Epson TM Utility) for making printer settings is provided.

Functions

- Offers network connection check function. (Wi-Fi model)
- Information necessary for connecting to the printer can be obtained using the NFC tag built in the printer or a QR code printed on a status sheet.
- It is possible to perform printing operations by scanning a barcode with a smart device's camera.

- Printing is possible through multiple built-in interfaces. See "Printing Using Multiple Interfaces" on page 33 for more details.
- Printing of various types of bar codes, GS1-DataBar, and two-dimensional symbols (PDF417, QR code, MaxiCode, Composite Symbology, Aztec Code, DataMatrix) is supported.
- A maintenance counter function is supported.



NFC Tag

- Use Epson ePOS SDK to build this function into your application.




1	Roll paper cover	Open this cover when installing or replacing the roll paper.
2	USB-C connector	Connects a USB-C cable.
3	Cover open lever	Operate this lever to open the roll paper cover.
4	Operation panel	There are buttons to operate the printer and LEDs to display the printer status.
5	Belt clip	A clip for hanging the printer from a waist belt.
6	Battery	Provides electricity to the printer. The printer does not work without the battery installed.
7	Wireless charging position	You can charge the printer by placing the printer on a commercially available wireless charger with the symbol on the printer aligned with the designated position on the charger.
8	NFCTag	A mark is printed here to indicate the position of the NFC tag. Bring an NFC-compatible device close to the mark to obtain information about the printer. For the functions using the NFC tag, refer to "Useful Functions for Smart Devices" on page 32.

Operation Panel

Wi-Fi model







U	Power button	This button turns the printer on or off.
†	Feed button	Press this button once to feed the roll paper for one line. Hold down this button to continue feeding the roll paper.
0	Power LED	This turns on when the printer is on.
!	Error LED	Turns on when the printer is temporarily unable to print, such as when no roll paper is loaded or the roll paper cover is open. Flashes when an error occurs.
•	Charge LED	Indicates whether the battery is charging or not.
_==	Battery LED	Indicates remaining battery charge.
	Wi-Fi LED	Turns on when the printer is connected to Wi-Fi.
*	Bluetooth LED	Turns on when the printer is connected via Bluetooth.

Buttons

(Power) button

This button turns the printer on or off.

- To turn on the printer, press the power button for about one second and release it when the power LED lights up.
- To turn off the printer, press the power button for about two seconds and release it when the power LED goes off or starts flashing.

NOTE

- After pressing the power button, it takes approximately the following time for the printer to initialize. This does not include the time it takes for communication to be established.
 - * Wi-Fi model: Approx. 5 seconds after the power LED lights up
 - * Bluetooth model: Approx. 5 seconds after the power LED lights up
- When turning on the power again immediately after turning off the power, make sure that all LEDs are off before turning on the power again.
- Always use the power button when turning off the power. If the battery is removed while the power is on, the maintenance counter value will not be updated correctly.
- If you want to turn off the printer without using the power button, it is recommended that you send the command to execute the power-off process to the printer before turning it off. This will save the latest maintenance counter values. The maintenance counter values are usually saved every two minutes. For more information about the command, see the ESC/POS Command Reference.

↑ Feed Button

- Press this button once to feed the roll paper for one line. Hold down this button to continue feeding the roll paper.
- When the Paper Layout Setting is Receipt paper (with black mark), the paper is fed to the print start position.

NOTE

The function of the paper feed button can be disabled (inoperative). Refer to the ESC/POS Command Reference for more details.

LED

NOTE

If a charged battery is not installed in the printer, the printer will not operate and the LED will not light.

Power LED (Blue)

- Stays on while the printer is on.
- Stays off while the printer is off.
- Flashes when the printer is in the following conditions.
 - Power-off standby process is in progress or power-off process is in progress
 - Updating the firmware
 - Starting up the network, or link-down
 - Resetting the printer or the communication settings is in progress
 - Network warning error

Error LED (Orange)

- Lights or flashes when an error occurs. For information about the flashing patterns, see "Status and Errors" on page 27.
- Lights after the power is turned on or after a reset (offline). Automatically goes out after a while to indicate that the printer is ready.
- Off when the printer is in standard mode (online).
- Lights up when the battery level is at the E level or when there is no battery remaining. See "Operation Mode When Battery is Low" on page 25 for information about the battery level.

■ Battery LED

Three LEDs indicate the battery level. These LEDs will not light unless you turn on the printer.

See "Operation Mode When Battery is Low" on page 25 for information about the battery level.

- A buzzer can be activated when the battery level reaches the L or S level. The buzzer setting can be made using TM-P80II Utility or in the software setting mode. See "Software Settings" on page 59 for more details.
- When the battery level reaches the E level, the error LED lights up.

Charge LED

Indicates whether the battery is charging or not.

- Stays on while the battery is charging.
- Flashes when there is an abnormality in battery charging.
- Turns off when the battery charge is complete and stays off while the battery is fully charged.

- Lights when the printer is connected to Wi-Fi and ready for communication.
- Flashes when the printer is temporarily unable to communicate, such as when it is obtaining an IP address after being connected to Wi-Fi.
- Off while the printer is not connected to Wi-Fi.

Bluetooth LED

- Lights while the printer is connected via Bluetooth.
- Flashes while the printer is waiting to be paired with another device.
- Off while the printer is not connected via Bluetooth.

Online and Offline

Online

The printer is online and ready for normal printing unless there is a reason to go offline.

Offline

The printer automatically goes offline under the following conditions:

- While the printer power is turning on/off
- While roll paper is fed using the Feed button
- When the printer stops printing due to a paper end (when the paper out detector detected the paper out)
- During an operation standby state
- When an error has occurred (See "Status and Errors" on page 27)
- While the roll paper cover is open
- When the battery level is at the E level or when there is no battery remaining



- The Error LED is lit while offline, but flashes when an error occurs.
- See "Operation Mode When Battery is Low" on page 25 for information about the battery level.
- A buzzer can be set to sound when the printer runs out of roll paper, an error occurs, or the battery power is low. The buzzer setting can be made using TM-P80II Utility or in the software setting mode. See "Software Settings" on page 59 for more details.

Power Supply Function

The auto power-off function and battery charging mode can be used to reduce battery consumption or minimize battery degradation.

NOTE

At low temperatures, battery performance is reduced. This is temporary and performance will be restored when the battery is returned to room temperature.

Auto Power-Off

The auto power-off function automatically turns off the printer if all of the following conditions are met after a certain period of time.

- Printing is not in progress.
- Paper is not being fed.
- Cover open/close operation is not in progress.
- No button is being pressed.
- No command is being received (receive buffer is empty) *Except for real-time commands.
- Bluetooth pairing is not in progress. (Bluetooth model)

The time for auto power-off can be set from 0 (disabled) to 60 minutes (in one-minute increments).

The default setting is "0" (disable).

NOTE

- The auto power-off setting can be made using TM-P80II Utility or in the software setting mode. See "Software Settings" on page 59 for more details.
- This function does not work when the USB interface is connected (the printer does not automatically turn off).
- The time set is the time to start the power off process, not the time when the power is turned off.

Battery Charge Mode

There are two battery charge modes for charging the battery: Mode 1 and Mode 2. The default setting is Mode 1.

NOTE

The battery charge mode can be changed using TM-P80II Utility or in the software setting mode. See "Software Settings" on page 59 for more details.

Mode 1

Charging begins when the battery level drops to approximately 80%. Controls the battery level so that it is always fully charged.

Mode 2

Charging begins when the battery level drops to 67% and continues charging until it reaches 80%.

Mode 2 is recommended when the printer is constantly connected to a USB charging adapter or computer. The number of times the battery needs to be recharged is reduced and battery degradation is mitigated.

Operation Mode When Battery is Low

There are two modes of operation when the battery is low: Mode 1 and Mode 2. The default setting is Mode 1.

NOTE

- The operation mode when battery is low can be changed using TM-P80II Utility or in the software setting mode. See "Software Settings" on page 59 for more details.
- The battery level is detected before printing begins, and the displayed level is subsequently updated. The battery LED does not indicate real-time battery level.
- When the battery level reaches the "L" level, it is recommended to recharge the battery or replace it with a charged battery.
- When the battery level reaches the "S" or "E" level, recharge the battery or replace it with a charged battery.
- A buzzer can be activated when the battery level reaches the L or S level. The buzzer setting can be changed using TM-P80II Utility or in the software setting mode. See "Software Settings" on page 59 for more details.

Mode 1

Allows you to print until the battery runs out.

Desktop Mode

Enabling the desktop mode may speed up the printing speed.

Disabling it will change the line feed speed according to the battery level. The default setting is "Disable". Enabling the mode is recommended when the printer is constantly connected to USB charging adapter or computer.

NOTE

The desktop mode can be set using TM-P80II Utility or in the software setting mode. See "Software Settings" on page 59 for more details.

Status and Errors

The status of the printer is indicated by lit and flashing LEDs.

CAUTION

You cannot print when an error has occurred.

NOTE

You cannot identify the error by the flashing patterns of the LEDs. Develop the application so that users can identify the error description and check the solutions.

- Battery charging should be performed under ambient temperatures within the guaranteed operating range of 0 to 40°C (32 to 104°F).
- Charging will stop if the ambient temperature is outside the chargeable temperature range (below 0°C or above 40°C).
- When charging in an environment of 35°C or higher, the charging time may be extended because the internal temperature rise is detected and charging is stopped and started repeatedly.

Error Status

When an error occurs, the printer goes offline and the error LED flashes.

There are three types of errors depending on the recovery method: automatically recoverable errors, recoverable errors, and unrecoverable errors.

Automatically Recoverable Errors

If an automatically recoverable error occurs, printing is not possible. The printer can recover from the errors as described below.

Error	Description	Recovery
Print head high temperature error	Head temperature exceeded the proper range (high temperature).	The printer recovers from the error when the head temperature drops.
Cover open error in the middle of printing	The roll paper cover was opened during printing.	The printer recovers from the error when the roll paper cover is closed.
Motor driver IC high temperature error	Motor driver IC temperature exceeded the proper range (high temperature).	The printer recovers from the error when the motor driver IC temperature drops.
Battery high temperature error	Battery temperature exceeded the proper range (high temperature).	The printer recovers from the error when the battery temperature drops.
Battery low temperature error	Battery temperature is below the proper range (low temperature).	The printer recovers from the error when the battery temperature rises.
Paper error	Black marks cannot be detected.	The printer recovers from the error when the paper is changed to paper with black marks.

Recoverable Errors

If a recoverable error occurs, printing is not possible. To restore the printer to its normal state, remove the cause of the error and then send an error recovery command.

NOTE

The error recovery command is valid only when a recoverable error (excluding automatic recovery errors) occurs.

Error	Description	Recovery
Auto cutter error	The cutter blade is locked due to a foreign object fell inside the printer or other reason.	Remove foreign objects or paper, and then close the roll paper cover to make the printer recover from the error. The printer automatically recovers from the error if the blade can be unlocked easily, however, make sure to check for foreign objects before use.
Paper layout error	The loaded paper is different from the settings.	Remove the cause of the error and then send an error recovery command to make the printer recover from the error.

NOTE

Instead of closing the roll paper cover, you can make the printer recover from the error using a dedicated command, however, doing so will cause the printer to go offline due to a cover open error.

Unrecoverable Errors

These include a high voltage error, CPU execution error, and communication unit error. If the error persists after turning the printer off and then on again, the printer may be defective. Contact your qualified service personnel.



If an unrecoverable error occurs, immediately turn off the power and remove the battery.

NV Memory (Non-Volatile Memory)

The printer's NV memory stores data even after the printer power is turned off. NV memory contains the following memory areas for the user:

- NV graphics memory
- User NV memory
- Memory switches (customized values)
- Maintenance counter



As a guide, NV memory rewriting should be used 10 times or less a day when you program applications.

NV Graphics Memory

Graphics, such as shop logos to be printed on receipts, can be registered.

To register your graphics data, use TM-P80II Utility or ESC/POS commands.

You can check registered graphics data using TM-P80II Utility or by printing the data in the NV graphics information print mode.

User NV memory

You can store and read text data for multiple purposes, such as for storing a note including customizing or maintenance information of the printer.

Memory Switches (customized values)

With the memory switches, which are software switches for the printer, you can configure various settings of the printer.

For information about the memory switch, see "Software Settings" on page 59.

Maintenance Counter

With this function, printer information, such as the number of lines printed, the number of autocuts, and printer operation time after the printer starts working, is automatically stored in printer's memory. You can read the counter information to use it for periodical checks or part replacement.

NOTE

- You can also check the head running length and number of times of autocutting with the self-test (see "Self-test Mode" on page 73).
- The maintenance counter values are automatically saved in the NV memory usually every two minutes (up to four minutes). However, the values are not saved when the printer is in power-saving mode or when it is turned off without the use of the Power button.
- Do not remove the battery when the printer is on. Doing so will cause the maintenance counter value to be incorrectly updated.

Useful Functions for Smart Devices

You can easily connect the printer to the network by using the NFC tag built-in to the printer or the QR code printed on the status sheet.

NFC Tag

Bring a smart device that supports NFC close to the NFC tag to acquire the printer information (information for specifying the device).

By using the acquired information, the device can specify the printer to send a print job over a network or Bluetooth.

QR Code

Capture the QR code printed on the status sheet with the camera on your smart device to acquire the printer information (information for specifying the device).

By using the acquired information, the device can specify the printer to send a print job over a network or Bluetooth.



- Programming using Epson ePOS SDK is required to use these functions. These functions can be
 achieved by combining NFC touch and QR code scanning operations with the identification of
 target printers using the Printer Easy Selection API.
 - See the "Epson ePOS SDK for Android/iOS User's Manual" and the Epson ePOS SDK sample program for more details. The sample program also contains a sample implementation method for reading an NFC tag and capturing a QR code.
- You can try a demo of these functions by using Epson TM Utility.

Printing Using Multiple Interfaces

The printer offers multiple interfaces and allows you to use all of them without limitation. You can use this function to temporarily connect a smart device to a nearby printer and print.

The printer provides each interface with an independent receive buffer and switches the active interface depending on the priority, while handling data in each receive buffer.

You can set one interface for the main connection. Data received from the main connection interface is handled with the highest priority.

By default, the interface that first receives data is set as the main connection interface; however, you can select the main connection interface in advance.

When the receive buffer for the active interface becomes empty and a preset time period (one second by default) has passed, switching to another interface is enabled, and an interface that receives print data becomes active.



When you do not use the Bluetooth function, set the Bluetooth security level to "Middle" or "High" to prevent unauthorized access to the printer over Bluetooth.

You can change the security level by using Epson TM Utility, TM-P80II Utility, or in the Interface Setup mode.




You can select the main connection interface and set the time to enable interface switching from the software settings. For details on software settings, see "Software Settings" on page 59.

Setup

This chapter describes the installation and setup procedures for the printer and peripheral devices required before using the printer.

Placing or Hanging the Printer

The printer can be placed on a horizontal surface such as a desk or hung vertically from your belt using the belt clip of the printer.




Placing the Printer on a Flat Surface

When using the printer on a flat surface, it is recommended to remove the belt clip from the printer. Remove the belt clip as shown below.

CAUTION

Do not repeatedly attach and detach the belt clip. The screw hole may be damaged and the belt clip may not be securely fastened.




Hanging the Printer from a Belt

By attaching the belt clip to your belt, you can hang the printer from your waist.

Hang the printer vertically with its operation panel facing up.

CAUTION

- Before use, make sure the belt clip is securely fastened to the printer and is not loose. Looseness may cause the printer to drop, resulting in injury or accident.
- Be careful not to drop the printer when hanging it with the belt clip.



Installing the Battery

The printer does not work without the battery installed.




Always use a OT-BY80II battery. Use of batteries other than OT-BY80II may result in fire, explosion, leakage, overheating, or other damage.

CAUTION

- Be sure to turn off the printer before removing the battery.
- Dispose of used batteries according to your local instructions.

How to Install the Battery

Insert the battery so that its tabs engage with the grooves on the printer, and fit it in until it clicks into place.




CAUTION

- When charging the battery, install the battery to the printer.
- Charge the battery in an environment of approximately 0 to 40 °C (32 to 104 °F).

NOTE

- When the printer is used for the first time, the battery needs to be charged for approximately 2.5 hours.
- Use a USB Type-C power adapter or USB port that complies with the USB Type-C Standard.
- Only USB Type-C standard power mode is supported. The charging time varies depending on the power supply capability and settings of the USB power adapter and port.

- Connect the included USB-C cable to the printer.
- Connect the USB-C cable to a commercially available USB power adapter or computer.
- The charge LED lights up when charging starts. If the battery level is close to full, charging will not start. Check the battery level with the battery LED.

- The charge LED turns off when charging is complete.





Wireless Charging


The battery can be charged using a commercially available wireless charger that supports the Qi standard.

Place the printer so that the **O** symbol (Wireless charging position) on the printer overlaps the position indicated in the wireless charger manual.

The charge LED lights up when charging starts. If the charge LED does not light up, reposition the printer in the correct position.

Check the battery LED for charge level.

Precautions for Wireless Charging


- For the procedure of wireless charging, refer to the manual of the wireless charger.
- Remove the belt clip when charging wirelessly.
 "Placing the Printer on a Flat Surface" on page 34
- When charging wirelessly, remove the optional belt strap, shoulder strap, and soft case.
- When charging, be sure to correctly align the printer's wireless charging position with that of the wireless charger.
- Depending on the wireless charger used, the charging position may not match and charging may not be performed properly.
- Charging may stop if the temperature of the printer exceeds a certain level during charging.
- If you charge wirelessly while the printer is on, the charge LED will stay on.
- Be careful not to allow foreign objects to get between the printer and the wireless charger. Foreign objects may generate heat or cause damages, resulting in improper charging.
- Disconnect the USB-C cable when charging wirelessly. Wireless charging will not work if the printer is connected to a computer or other device.
- The charging time with wireless charging is as follows.




Installing or Replacing the Roll Paper

- Before installing the roll paper, make sure that the roll paper is not deformed. Using a deformed roll paper will cause the printer to malfunction.

- Open the roll paper cover.



Anti-Curl Function

The printer is equipped with the anti-curl function. The function reduces the curl of the roll paper after printing.


Disabling the anti-curl function speeds up printing.

When the remaining amount of roll paper is low and is about to reach the core, the anti-curl function declines.



Connecting the Printer to the Host Device

USB Interface

When using the USB-C cable to connect with host device, connect the USB-C cable to the printer, and after starting the host device, turn the printer on.



- Do not place any weight or stress on the cable when using. Doing so could damage the cable and connectors.
- Use a USB-C cable that complies with the USB 2.0 standard. Using a non-compliant cable may cause the printer to malfunction due to static electricity.

Bluetooth Interfaces (Bluetooth model)

Pair the printer with your device using the Bluetooth function of the device or using other methods. Pairing the printer is also possible by using EPSON TM Bluetooth Connector (Windows) or Epson TM Utility (iOS or Android).



- If the host computer and the printer are not connected on a continuous basis but rather
 connected every time the printer starts printing, some time may be needed for the printer to
 actually start printing after the host computer commands printing. This pause is the time
 required for processing the connection between the host computer and the printer, and it
 depends on the conditions of the environment where used.
- If data transfer from an application of the host computer has already been completed, data
 might remain in the Bluetooth module internal buffer. Since data remaining in the buffer may
 be discarded when the connection is disconnected, when disconnecting the wireless
 connection immediately after printing, use status or other means to confirm that the
 transmitted data has been printed reliably.



- The default device name is TM-P80II_xxxxxx. The "xxxxxxxx" is the last 6 digits of the printer serial number. The device name can be edited using the TM-P80II Utility or Epson TM Utility.
- The default Bluetooth security level is "Middle". For information on the Bluetooth security settings, see "Interface Setup Mode" on page 78.
- For details on the Bluetooth interface, see "Bluetooth Interface (Bluetooth model)" on page 112.
- For detailed information about EPSON TM Bluetooth Connector, see the TM Bluetooth Connector User's Manual.

Setting up from a Smart Device

• Smart device for setting: iOS or Android device

Setup Procedure

- On your smart device, open the Bluetooth settings from Settings.
- Turn on Bluetooth on the smart device.
- **Q** Open the roll paper cover of the printer.
- With the roll paper cover open, press and hold the Feed button for about one second until the buzzer sounds, then release it.
- **5** Close the roll paper cover.

A guidance that starts with "Next Action" will be printed.

Select [Bluetooth Status sheet]. Briefly press the Feed button (less than one second), and then hold down the button for at least one second.

A status sheet will be printed and the printer will be ready for pairing.

- 7 Select the same device name printed on the status sheet from the list of connectable devices on the smart device and pair it.
- When you see that the printer is connected, the connection is complete.

NOTE

- The default setting of the Device Name printed on the status sheet is TM-P80II_xxxxxx. "xxxxxx" is the last six digits of the printer serial number.

- With the roll paper cover open, press and hold the Feed button for about one second until the buzzer sounds, then release it.
- Close the roll paper cover.

Select [Bluetooth Status sheet]. Briefly press the Feed button (less than one second), and then hold down the button for at least one second.

A status sheet will be printed and the printer will be ready for pairing.





NOTE

- If "Error" is displayed when you click the [Search] on the TM Bluetooth Connector, check whether:
 - * The Bluetooth adapter is installed to the computer.
 - * Bluetooth is ON in the Windows settings.
- If the device is not displayed on the TM Bluetooth Connector or the TM Bluetooth Connector Status shows "> after pairing, check the following.
 Check whether:
 - * Make sure the printer is turned on.
 - * Make sure the printer is no more than 10 meters away from the computer.
 - * Confirm that there is no other wireless device, such as a microwave oven and cordless telephone, that can interfere with the Bluetooth printer.
 - * If the printer and the computer are placed in different rooms separated by a wall, move the printer and/or the computer in the same room.
 - * The printer may not be detected when the search time is short. Try search again with longer search time.
 - * While a computer and printer are communicating, the printer cannot be detected by other computers. Confirm that the printer to be detected is not communicating with any computer.

Wi-Fi Interface (Wi-Fi model)

The printer has "SimpleAP" mode that allows a device to directly connect to the printer without using an access point. This makes it easy to set up a printer to connect to a wireless LAN using the printer setting tool, without having to go through a network environment such as an access point.





- When you set up the access point at the same time, set the access point in advance and check that it operates correctly.
- If the SSID of the access point to which the printer is connected is "EpsonNet", the printer cannot be connected. Change the SSID to a name other than "EpsonNet".

 Note that the default SSID of the printer is "EpsonNet". The SSID will return to "EpsonNet" when the printer is initialized using the initialization menu in Interface Setup Mode.
- Examine the radio wave situation in the surrounding area before use.
- Avoid using the same channel that is used in the neighboring shops where Wireless LAN is used.
- When using the printer in environments where kitchen microwaves and other devices that may interfere radio waves are installed, observe the following points.
 - * Keep the printer away from the devices, such as kitchen microwaves, that may cause radio wave interference.
 - * Use channels that are away from the frequency bands that may cause radio wave interference.
 - * Place shields between the printer and the devices that may cause radio wave interference.
 - * Select either 2.4 GHz or 5 GHz, whichever is free from radio wave interference.
 - * In auto channel setting for the access point, do not select a channel in which the devices may cause radio wave interference.

About SimpleAP (Wi-Fi Direct)

- The printer acts as an access point in the SimpleAP mode and allows up to eight devices to connect to the printer. However, devices directly connected to the printer cannot communicate with each other through the printer.
- The printer can be connected with SimpleAP while being connected to a wireless LAN. However, if the printer is already connected to a wireless LAN and setting using the SimpleAP mode is started, the wireless LAN connection is temporarily disconnected.
- Since the default IP address of SimpleAP is 172.16.10.1, do not use 172.16.x.x as the IP address for the wireless LAN. If you use it, the SimpleAP function will stop to avoid IP address conflicts. However, if you restart SimpleAP in the above state, you can start SimpleAP with IP address conflict avoided.
- Even if you have not changed your passphrase, you may be prompted to enter your passphrase. In that case, enter the serial number of the printer.

Starting the Printer in the SimpleAP Mode

The printer is shipped from the factory with the SimpleAP enabled.

The printer automatically starts in the SimpleAP mode and prints the "SimpleAP Start" sheet when it is turned on with the following conditions; SimpleAP enabled, not connected to a wireless LAN/USB device, and wireless LAN settings have not been configured.



NOTE

You can also manually start the printer in the SimpleAP mode.

The procedure for starting the printer in the SimpleAP mode using the status sheet printing function is as follows.

- Turn on the printer.
- **Open the roll paper cover.**
- 3 Install the roll paper.

- Close the roll paper cover.

 A guidance that starts with "Next Action" will be printed.
- Select "5:SimpleAP". Press the Feed button briefly (less than one second) five times, and then hold down the button for at least one second.

The printer will start in the SimpleAP mode and print "SimpleAP Start" sheet.

Setting up using Web Config

Start the printer in the SimpleAP mode and connect to a wireless LAN using Web Config. Web Config is a printer's built-in web page that allows you to check and change printer settings on your browser.

NOTE

How to connect a smart device to a printer via wireless LAN is also introduced in the video manual. See "Manuals for This Product" on page 10 for more details.

Necessary Items

Prepare the following items.

• A device for the setup which has a web browser.

Setup Procedure

1 Start the printer in the SimpleAP mode.

The "SimpleAP Start" sheet is printed. The "Starting the Printer in the SimpleAP Mode" on page 50



- Scan the QR code on the sheet with the device for setup.
- Select the SSID printed on the sheet on the "Wi-Fi" screen of the device.

Web Config screen will be automatically displayed.

NOTE

If the QR code cannot be scanned or the screen is not displayed, start your web browser on the device and enter the IP address of the printer in the address field.

- 4 Select the [Wi-Fi] menu.
- **5** Enter the password and select "OK" to log in to Web Config.

The default password is the serial number of the printer. The serial number is printed on the "SimpleAP Start" sheet.

NOTE

The password can be changed from "Change Administrator Password" in the Product Security tab of Web Config.

- From the list of SSIDs displayed, select the SSID of the network you want to connect to.
- **7** Enter your network password and select "OK".

When the Wi-Fi LED lights up, the connection is complete.

Setting up using Epson TM Utility

Start the printer in the SimpleAP mode and connect to a wireless LAN using the TM Utility.

Cleaning

Cleaning the Printer Case

If the exterior surface is noticeably dirty, follow the steps below to clean it.

CAUTION

Never clean the product with alcohol, benzine, thinner, or other such solvents. Doing so may damage or break the parts made of plastic and rubber.



- Disconnect the USB-C cable, if it is connected.
- **?** Wipe off the dirt with a dry or slightly damp cloth.

Cleaning the Thermal Head

Epson recommends cleaning the thermal head to maintain receipt print quality. We recommend cleaning periodically (about once every 3 months).



- After printing, the thermal head and its surroundings can be very hot. Be careful not to touch it and to let it cool before you clean it.
- Do not damage the thermal head by touching it with your fingers or any hard object.
- **1** Turn off the printer.
- **Disconnect the USB-C cable, if it is connected.**
- **Q** Open the roll paper cover and then remove roll paper.
- Clean the thermal head with a cotton swab moistened with alcohol solvent (ethanol or isopropyl alcohol).




When the cleaned area is completely dry, load the roll paper and close the roll paper cover.

Cleaning the Platen Roller and Paper Detector

Depending on the roll paper used, paper dust may stick to the platen roller and the paper may not be fed correctly. Follow the procedure below to remove the paper dust.

To maintain receipt print quality, we recommends cleaning the platen roller and the paper detector periodically (about once every 3 months).

- **1** Turn off the printer.
- Disconnect the USB-C cable, if it is connected.
- **Q** Open the roll paper cover and then remove roll paper.
- Use a cotton swab lightly moistened with water to remove paper dust from the platen roller and paper detector.



When the cleaned area is completely dry, load the roll paper and close the roll paper cover.

Troubleshooting

When the Roll Paper Jams

When a paper jam occurs, never pull out the paper with too much force. Open the roll paper cover and remove the jammed paper.

Follow the procedure below to remove jammed paper.




Do not touch the thermal head and its surroundings. They may be hot immediately after printing.



If you touch paper during printing or before cutting operation is finished, a paper jam or auto cutter error (unable to cut) may occur.

- 1 Turn off the printer.
- Disconnect the USB-C cable, if it is connected.
- Open the roll paper cover.
- Remove the jammed paper.
- Install the roll paper and close the roll paper cover.



When the Roll Paper Cover dose Not Open

If the roll paper cover does not open even after pulling the cover open lever, turn the printer off and then on again.

Printout is Faint

If your print out is faint or banding appears as shown below, the thermal print head may be stained badly. Clean the thermal print head and check that the problem is solved.

Cannot Print

If you cannot print from the printer even though no errors have occurred, run a self-test to see if you can print with the printer alone. If the printer is connected to a computer or smart device via Wi-Fi or Bluetooth, check the Wi-Fi LED or Bluetooth LED to see if they are connected properly.

Follow the steps below.

- 1 Close the roll paper cover.
- While pressing the freed button, turn on the printer. (Hold down the freed button until printing starts.)

After printing the current print status, a continuing self-test guidance is printed, and the \bigcirc power LED flashes.

3 Briefly press the 🕂 Feed button (less than one second) to continue the self-test.

The printer prints using the built-in character set.

After "*** completed ***" is printed, the printer is reset and switches to standard mode.



Hexadecimal Dumping Mode

In hexadecimal dumping mode, data from the host device is printed in hexadecimal numbers and characters. By comparing the print outs and the program, you can check whether or not data is being sent to the printer correctly.



- When there are no characters that correspond to the print data, "." is printed.
- If you press the Feed button when there is less than one line of print data, one line is printed.
- During hexadecimal dumping mode, applications that check the printer status may not operate correctly. The printer only returns the status for the "Real-time transmission status" command.

Follow the steps below. Entering the hexadecimal dumping mode is also possible using the ESC/POS commands.

- 1 Open the roll paper cover.
- While pressing the Feed button, turn on the printer. (Hold down the Feed button until the Error LED turns on.)
- Close the roll paper cover.

From this point, all data received by the printer is printed in the corresponding hexadecimal numbers and ASCII characters.

To close hexadecimal dumping mode, turn off the printer after printing is complete, or press the Feed button for three times.

Printing a Status Sheet

Follow the steps below to check the interface settings.

NOTE

You cannot print after turning on the power while the Power LED is flashing.

- 1 Check that the printer is on.
- Open the roll paper cover.
- Install the roll paper.
- Press and hold the Feed button for about 1 second until the buzzer sounds.
- Close the roll paper cover.

 A guidance that starts with "Next Action" will be printed.
- Press the Feed button briefly (less than one second) the number of times equal to the number indicated to the left of the status sheet you want to print, then hold down the button for at least one second.

Printing of a status sheet will start. The printer will return to normal mode after printing is finished.





This section describes information that you should be aware of when developing systems and applications using this product.

Notes on Printing Barcodes and Two-Dimensional Symbols

- Ensure adequate space around the code; "quiet zone" that is required for the code.
- To print PDF417 (two-dimensional symbol), the following settings are recommended.

Module height: 3 to 5 times the module width

Vertical size of the symbol: approximately 5 mm {0.20"} or more

- The recognition rate of ladder bar codes and two-dimensional symbols may vary depending on widths of the
 modules, print density, environmental temperature, type of paper, and characteristics of the reader. Make
 sure to check the recognition rate beforehand to determine the settings and use conditions so that the restrictions of the reader are satisfied.
- Reading quality of multi-gradation bar codes and two-dimensional symbols is not guaranteed.
- When printing a ladder barcode or two-dimensional symbol that is created as a graphics data, set the print speed to level 5.



Notes on use

- When you initialize or change the printer settings, the printer is reset to reflect the settings. It may take about 1 minute depending on the network settings or environment. Also, your application may indicate power off during the time waiting for reset. In that case, wait for about 1 minute, and then reconnect to the printer.
- In areas where Wi-Fi communication is congested, your application may erroneously recognize that communication is disconnected and indicate power off due to response delay. Also, depending on the combination with the access point used, Wi-Fi communication performance may be degraded. Both of these issues may be improved by disabling the Wi-Fi power saving function (Power Save). However, since the power saving function is disabled, the printer will consume more power. The setting can be changed using Web Config or TM-P80II Utility.

Auto Reconnect Feature

The auto reconnect feature allows the printer to automatically restore a connection in the following situations if the Bluetooth connection to the iOS device is lost.

- When the printer is turned on
- When the signal is dropped and then restored

The following shows the printer operations and connection methods when the auto reconnect feature is enabled or disabled.

Notes on use

Time required until printing starts

- If the host computer and the printer are not connected on a continuous basis but rather connected every time the printer starts printing, some time may be needed for the printer to actually start printing after the host computer commands printing. This pause is the time required for processing the connection between the host computer and the printer.
 - After opening the port, leave an interval of 300 msec or more before sending data to the port.
- After turning on the printer, wait until the initialization process is complete (about 40 seconds) before printing or making settings via Bluetooth.

Timing to shut the connection off

Even if data transfer from the application on the host computer has already been completed, the data may remain in the printer's internal buffer. Since data remaining in the buffer may be discarded when the connection is disconnected, when disconnecting the wireless connection immediately after printing, use status or other means to confirm that the transmitted data has been printed reliably.

If a connection between the host computer and the printer is shut off while the printer is offline, it may not be re-established. In this case, first clear the printer offline causes, and then try to re-establish the connection.

Notes when communicating with iOS devices

Print data deletion and Bluetooth disconnections occur

Situation

Depending on the specifications of the iOS device, print data sent to the printer may be deleted. When this occurs, the Bluetooth connection between the printer and the iOS device is disconnected.

Conditions

This occurs when the printer is not ready to print, and 64 KB or more of print data is sent to the printer.

<Status in which the printer cannot print>

- When the roll paper cover is open
- When the paper is out

Solution

Do not send data to the printer if the printer is not ready to print.

For developers using the SDK from Epson, see the User's Manual - Chapter 3 Programming Guide - "Printing After Checking the Printer Status".

Since Bluetooth is disconnected when this occurs, if the auto reconnect feature is not enabled, you need to reconnect from the Bluetooth settings screen on the iOS device.

When using the SDK from Epson, this connection process is not necessary.

The iOS application cannot receive the data sent from the printer

Situation

Although the printer sends data to the iOS device and the data is received by the iOS device, depending on the combination of the iOS version and the iOS device, the iOS application may not be able to receive the data.

Conditions

This may occur in combinations of the following conditions.

- iOS version: 7.1, 7.1.1
- iOS device: iPhone 5s, iPhone 5c, iPhone 5, iPad Air, iPad mini 3, iPad (4th generation), iPad mini, iPod touch (5th generation), iPhone 4s, iPhone 4, iPad (3rd generation), iPad 2
- Application processing: If the Bluetooth port is closed and then reopened while the application is running.

Solution

The solution differs depending on the iOS device being used. See the following table.
