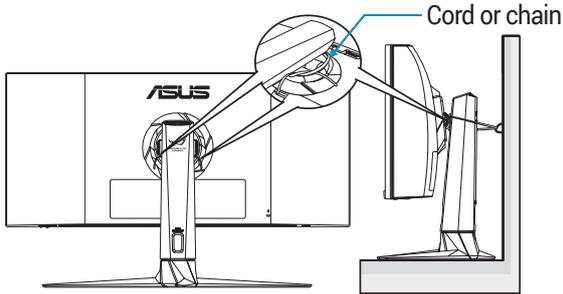

Prevent Tipping

When using the display, fasten the LCD to a wall using a cord or chain that can support the weight of the monitor in order to prevent the monitor from falling.

Care & Cleaning

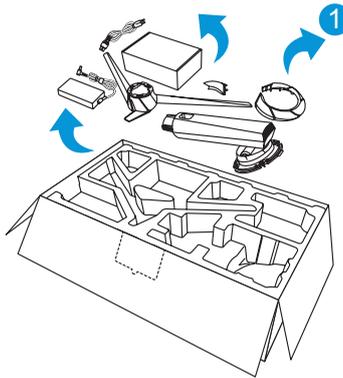
1.3 Assembling the Monitor

To assemble the monitor:

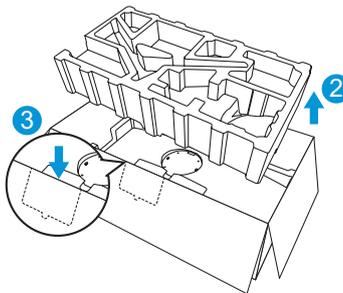


- While assembling the monitor arm/base, we recommend that you keep the monitor inside its EPS (Expanded Polystyrene) packaging.

1. Take out all accessory from the upside EPS.

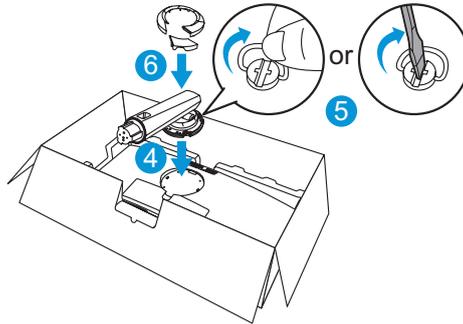


2. Take out upside EPS from carton box.
3. Push open stand assembly hole.

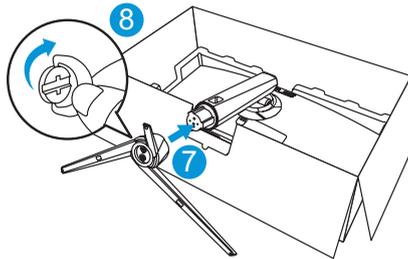


4. Align the screw holes on the monitor with the bundled screws on the arm.
5. Install the arm to the monitor and fix by fastening the four (4) bundled screws.

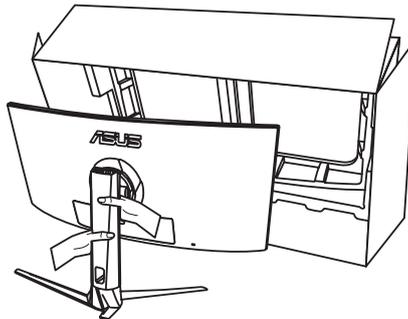
- Cover the VESA cover.



- Align and install the base to the arm.
- Fix the base to the arm by fastening the two (2) bundled screws.



- Remove the monitor from its EPS packaging.

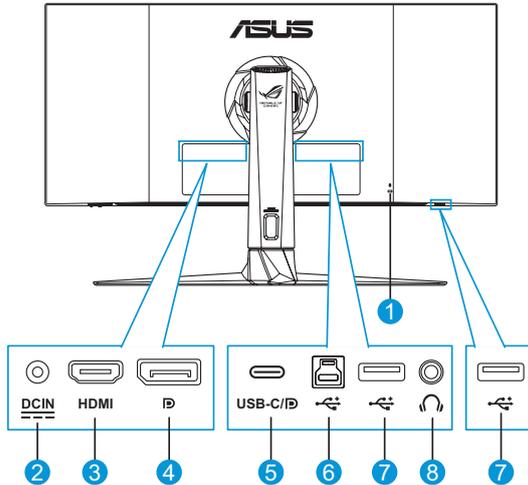


- Please do not hold the panel, we recommend hold the monitor stand to pick up monitor.

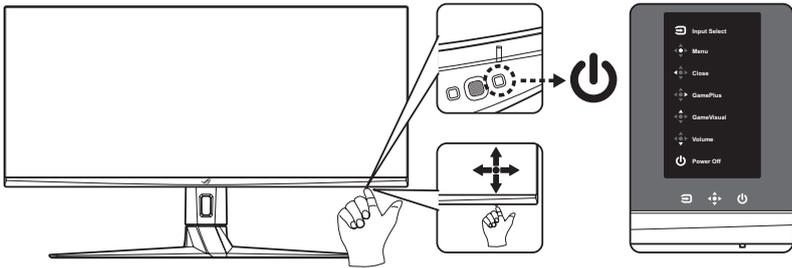
1.5 Monitor Introduction

1.5.1 Using the Control Buttons

Use control buttons on the bottom of the monitor to adjust the monitor settings.



- Press the Input Select  button or the  button to call out the quick OSD menu.



1. Power Indicator:

2. Power Button:

- Press this button to turn the monitor on/off.

3. Navigation Button:

- Turn on the OSD menu. Enact the selected OSD menu item.
- Increase/Decrease values or moves your selection up/down/left/right.
-  Close Button: Exit the OSD menu or move to the previous menu.

-  **GamePlus Button:** This is a shortcut key. The default setting is GamePlus.
 - Activate Crosshair, Timer, FPS Counter, or Display Alignment function.
 - Move the  button up/down to select and press  to confirm the function needed.

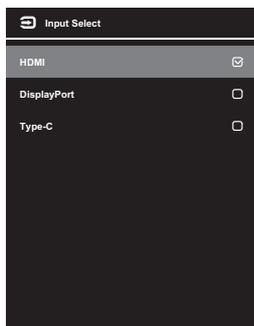

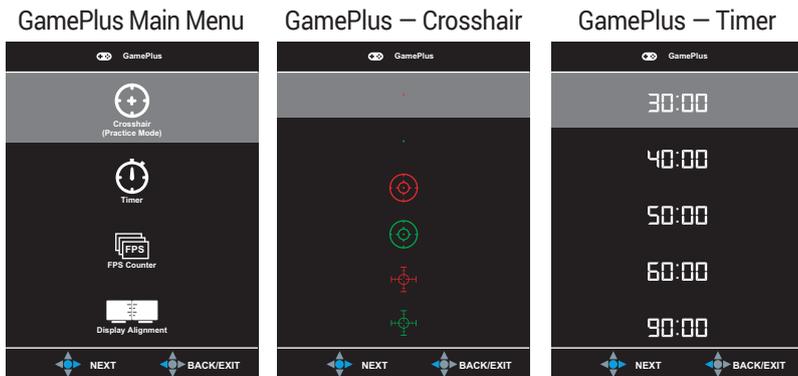


1.5.2 GamePlus Function

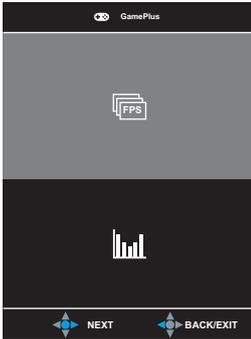
The GamePlus function provides a toolkit and creates a better gaming environment for users when playing different types of games. The crosshair overlay with four different crosshair options lets you choose the one that best suits the game you are playing. There is also an onscreen timer you can position on the left of the display so you can keep track of the elapsed gaming time; while the FPS (frames per second) counter lets you know how smooth the game is running. Display Alignment displays alignment lines on 4 sides of the screen, serving as an easy and handy tool for you to line up multiple monitors perfectly.

To active GamePlus:

1. Press the  or Input Select  button to display the quick OSD menu.
2. Press the GamePlus hotkey .
3. Move the  button up/down to select among different functions.
4. Press the  button or move the  button right to confirm the function you choose, and move the  button up/down to navigate through the settings. Move the  button left to go back, off, or exit.
5. Highlight the desired setting and press the  button to activate it. Press the Input Select  button to inactivate it.

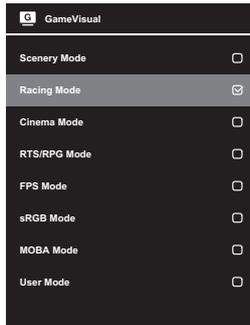

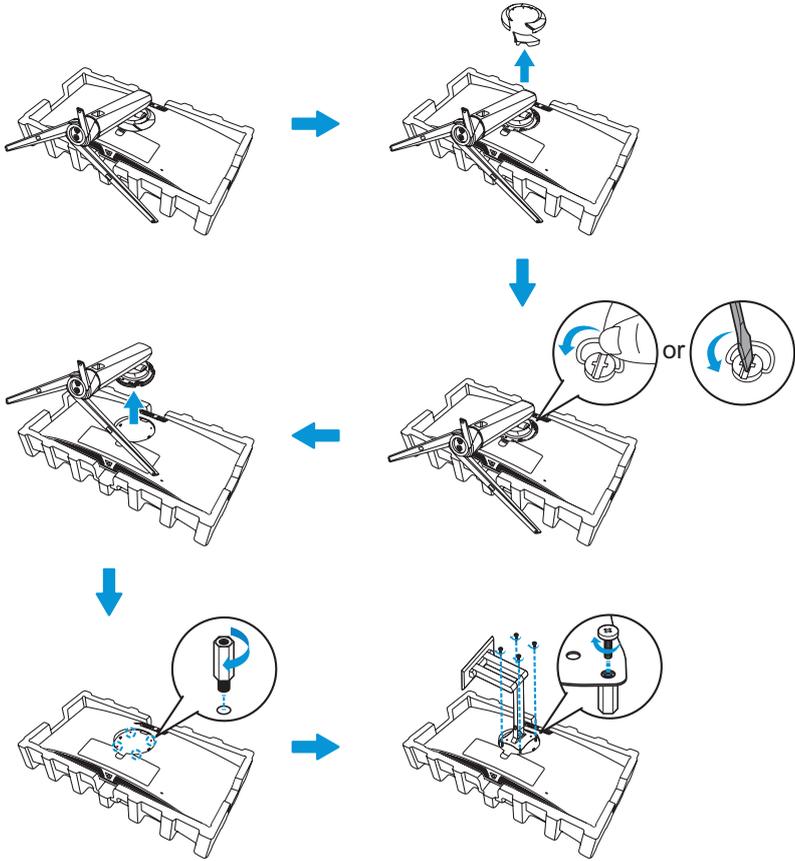
2.1 Detaching the Stand (for VESA Wall Mount)

- Avoid damaging the monitor surface. While detaching the monitor stand, always keep the monitor inside its EPS packaging.

The detachable stand of this monitor is specially designed for VESA wall mount.

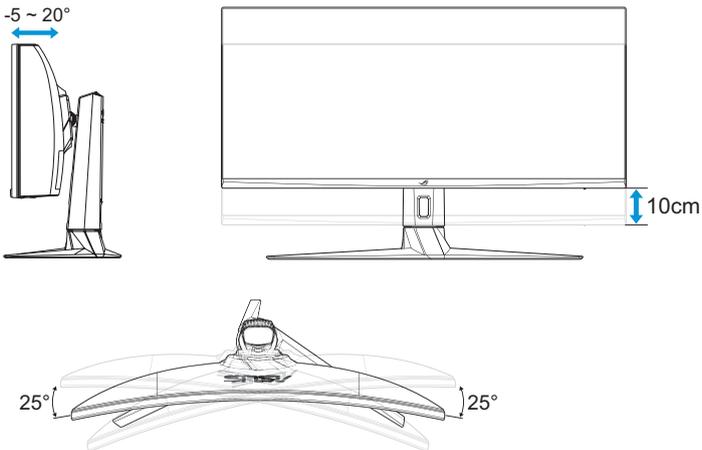
1. Disconnect power and signal cables. Carefully put the monitor facedown on its EPS packaging.
2. Remove the covers on where the monitor and the arm meet.
3. Loosen the four (4) bundled screws securing the arm to the rear of the monitor.
4. Detach the stand (arm and base) from the monitor.
5. Attach the four screw standoffs to the respective screw holes on the rear of the monitor.
6. Secure the wall mount bracket to the monitor with the four (4) screws.

- The VESA wall mount kit (100 x 100 mm) is purchased separately.
 - Use only the UL Listed Wall Mount Bracket with minimum weight/load 22.7kg (screw size is M4 x 10 mm).

2.2 Adjusting the Monitor

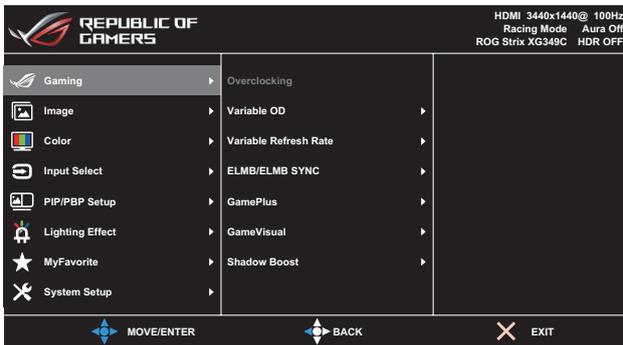
- For optimal viewing, we recommend that you look at the full face of the monitor, then adjust the monitor to the angle that is most comfortable for you.
- Hold the stand to prevent the monitor from falling when you change its angle.
- You can adjust the monitor's angle from -5° to 20° and it allows 25° swivel adjustment from either left or right. You can also adjust the monitor's height within ± 10 cm.

- It is normal that the monitor slightly shakes while you adjust the viewing angle.

3.1 OSD (On-Screen Display) Menu

3.1.1 How to Reconfigure

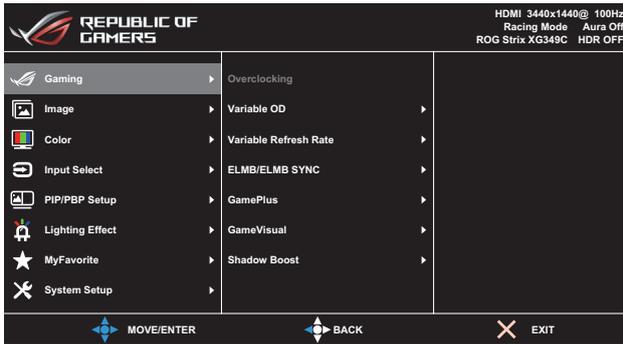


1. Press the  button or Input Select  button to display the quick OSD menu.
2. Press the  button to activate the OSD menu.
3. Move the  button up/down to navigate through the functions. Highlight the desired function and press the  button or move the  button right to enter its sub-menu. In submenu, move the  button up/down again to navigate through the sub-menu functions. Highlight the desired sub-menu function and press the  button to select an option or move the  button up/down to adjust the setting.
4. Move the  button up/down to change the settings of the selected function.
5. To exit and save the OSD menu, press the Input Select  button or move the  button left repeatedly until the OSD menu disappears. To adjust other functions, repeat steps 1 to 4.

3.1.2 OSD Function Introduction

1. Gaming

Configure your gaming preferences.



- **Overclocking:** Allows to adjust the refresh rate.



- Overclocking is available only if the input source is DisplayPort.

- **Variable OD:** Speeds up the response time by Over Drive technology. Including **Level 0~Level 5**.
- **Variable Refresh Rate:** Allows a Variable Refresh Rate supported graphics source to dynamically adjust display refresh rate based on typical content frame rates for power efficient, virtually stutter free and low-latency display update.



- To activate Variable Refresh Rate, turn off ELMB function first.
- Variable Refresh Rate can only be activated within:
 - HDMI source: 48Hz ~ 100Hz
 - Type C source: 48Hz ~ 120Hz
 - DisplayPort source: 48Hz ~ 144Hz
 - DisplayPort OverClocking source: 48Hz ~ 180Hz

- **ELMB/ELMB SYNC:** Extreme Low Motion Blur. Decreases motion blur and minimizes ghosting part when on-screen objects are fast moving.

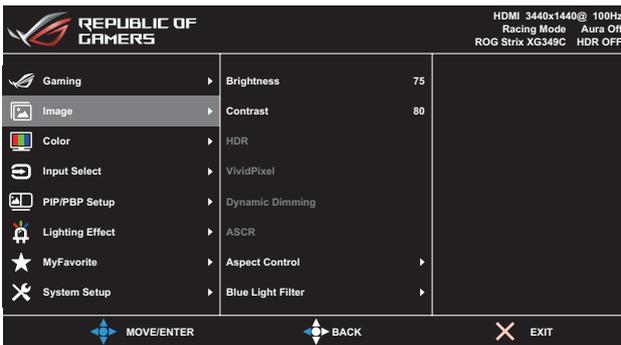


- To activate ELMB, turn off Variable Refresh Rate function first.

- ELMB is disabled if input V frequency is less than 75Hz.

- **Shadow Boost:** Adjusts the monitor gamma curve to enrich the dark tones in an image making dark scenes and objects much easier be found. Available options: **OFF, Level 1~ Level 3.**

- **VividPixel:** ASUS Exclusive Technology that brings lifelike visuals for crystal-clear and detail-oriented enjoyment. The adjusting range is from **0** to **100**.

- **Dynamic Dimming:** Synchronizes with contents while contrast changing to execute backlight dynamic dimming.
- **ASCR:** Select **ON** or **OFF** to enable or disable dynamic contrast ratio function.

- ASCR is not available if the Dynamic Dimming function is enabled.

- **Aspect Control:** Adjusts the aspect ratio to **Full**, **4:3**, **16:9 (24"W)**, and **16:9 (27"W)**.

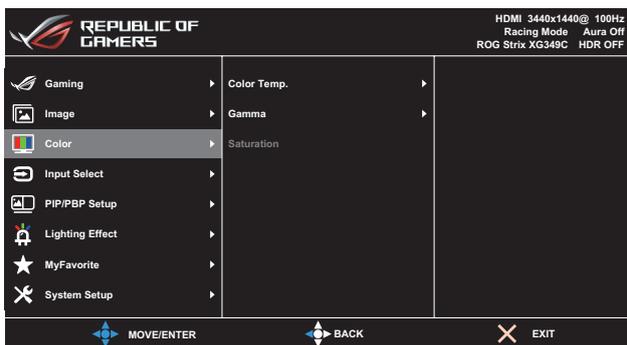


Please refer to the following to alleviate eye strains:

- Users should take some time away from the display if working for long hours. It is advised to take short breaks (at least 5 mins) after around 1 hour of continuous working at the computer. Taking short and frequent breaks is more effective than a single longer break.
 - To minimize eye strain and dryness in your eyes, users should rest the eye periodically by focusing on objects that are far away.

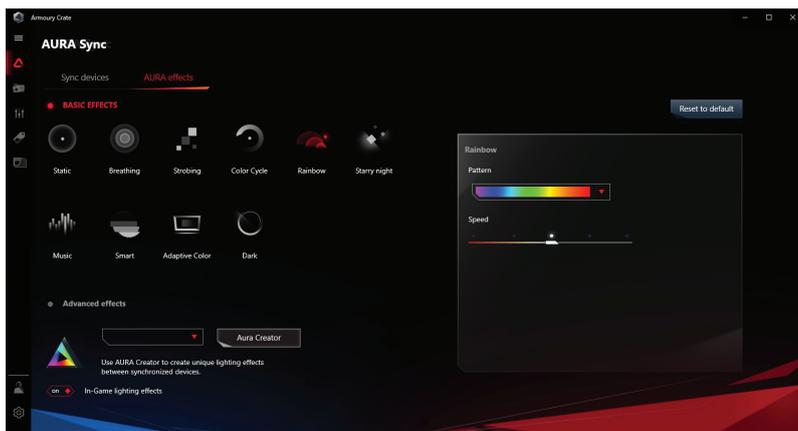
3.2 Aura

Armoury Crate is a software program that controls the colorful LEDs on supported devices, such as monitors, motherboards, graphic cards, desktop PCs, etc. Aura allows you to adjust the color of the RGB LEDs on these devices and select different light effects. You can also correct or adjust the color of the LEDs by calibrating them.

To activate Aura:

1. Turn ON the **Aura Sync** function in the OSD menu.
2. Connect the USB 3.0 upstream port of the monitor to the USB port of your computer.
3. Install Armoury Crate and then restart the computer.
4. Execute Armoury Crate.

Below is the overview of this program.



- If the USB upstream connection between the monitor and computer is disconnected, to resume the Aura function, you need to re-connect the USB 3.0 upstream port of the monitor to the computer and then restart the computer.
